

TREASURE TRAIL – Tuesday 29th May 2018

- Please make sure you have registered your team and that you sign out at the end of the walk.
- The Treasure Trail is self-led, and all participants are responsible for their own safety.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Please call the Cardiac Rehab Centre on 01420 544794 if assistance is required.

Leave the Cardiac Rehab Centre (please be aware of cars / sports centre development vehicles) and turn left after the houses. Pass under the railway bridge and follow along Mounter's Lane past Elm Lodge and Mounter's Lodge. (This first section of the walk may be muddy therefore please take care you do not slip on the steps). After a few yards, turn sharp right to the underpass. Stop and look at the map.

Q1. Where would you go if you travelled along the A32?
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A. FAREHAM

Go through the underpass.

Q2. How many lights are there in the underpass?

A. 19

Q3. What is not permitted to do by law in the subway?

A. SMOKING

Continue along the road towards Chawton keeping to the footpath on the right.

Q4. What is depicted on the house sign of The Old Post Office?
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A. HORSE & CARRIAGE

Q6. What are the two hedgehogs doing in front of Vincent Cottage?

A. PUSING WHEELBARROW / SITTING IN ARMCHAIR
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Q6. What is available for Dapper Dogs?
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A. GROOMING

Continue along the road keeping to the pavement on the right.

Q7. How many windows are visible from the pavement outside Ivy Cottage, inc. the garage?
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A. 9

Q8. What did the single storey building close to the pavement, which has a chimney and a stable door, used to be?

A. FORGE

Q9. Who owns the bus shelter?

A. CLINKERS c1550

Q10. What time would catch a bus to Alton College?
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A. 09:29AM

Q11. When did Jane Austen live in Chawton?
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Fact: The pattern surrounding the plaque is from the wallpaper found in the house.

A. 1809 - 1817

Q12. Who opened the house as a museum?
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A. DUKE OF WELLINGTON

Continue following the pavement around the corner to the right as far as Pound Farm.

Q13. Can you hear music? How many bronze sculptures are there and what are they?

A. **3 FROGS & 1 BOAR**

Q14. What is depicted on the gate across from the farm entrance?

A. **1 SHEEP & 3 LAMBS**

Turn around and walk back towards the village crossing over to the footpath on the right-hand side, passing Thatch Cottage and Chawton Lodge.

Q15. Where does the brown sign opposite Chawton Lodge point to?

A. **CHAWTON HOUSE LIBRARY**

At the corner cross over the road and continue walking along the pavement on the left-hand side with the recreation ground on your left.

Q16. What is forbidden on the recreation ground?

A. **HORSE RIDING**

Q17. When was the school established?

A. **1840**

Q18. When was the school first extended?

A. **1993**

Q19. Who is the current headteacher and what is the email address?

A. **MISS DAWN TILLEY - headteacher@chawton.hants.sch.uk**

Q20. How many faces are there on the clock at the friendship stop?

A. **11**

Continue along the pavement passing Ferney Close on your right.

Q21. What is the footpath from Ferney Close part of?

A. **ST. SWITHUNS WAY**

Pass the entrance to Home Farm and stop at the head of the drive leading to Chawton House Library.

Q22. Who owned Chawton House during Jane Austen's time in the village?

A. **HER BROTHER EDWARD**

Q23. What is the admission fee, to visit the garden, for 2 adults, 1 x 7-year-old and 1 x 4-year-old?

A. **£13.00**

Go down the drive to the church.

Q24. Who would have lived in the brown hut on the left-hand side of the drive?

A. **SHEPHERD**

Q25. What is the church called?

A. **ST. NICHOLAS**

Q26. Which benefice does it belong to?

A. **NORTHANGER**

Q27. Which of Jane Austen's relatives are buried in the church yard?

A. **MOTHER & SISTER**

(If the church is open and there is no service taking place why not stop and have a look around.)

Retrace your steps back towards the recreation ground. Turn right into the recreation ground, opposite the school, and follow the path for a few yards.

Q28. What is the small thatched building in front of you?

A. **PAVILLION**

Turning to your left, walk through the trees in the direction of the children's playground – don't cross the bridge.

Q29. What is Simon's strip?

A. **A STRIP OF LAND DEDICATED TO SIMON CHANNON**

Q30. One tree is dedicated to a local historian. What was her name?

A. **VIOLET HUNT**

When you get to the car park turn right and to the end of the car park. Follow the footpath sign until you cross over the bridge. Stop and look at the map.

Q31. What are the woods in front of you called?
A. MINGLEDOWN
Q32. What kind of footpath goes through them?
A. PERMISSIVE
Q33. What should you leave behind and collect when you go through the woods?
A. LEAVE NOTHING BUT FOOTPRINTS / TAKE AWAY ONLY MEMORIES

(If you want to take a walk through the woods then do so – the circular walk takes approx. 20 mins.)

Retrace your footsteps back through the car park to the main street. Turn right past Cassandra's Tea House and follow the pavement on the right-hand side of the road.

Q34. What food hygiene rating has Cassandra's Tea House been given?
A. 5 RATING
Q35. What time is the post collected on Fridays?
A. 5.00PM
Q36. What is the name of the pub?
A. THE GREYFRIAR
Q37. Where is the Griffin brewery?
A. CHISWICK
Q38. What year was the foundation stone of the village hall laid?
A. 1923
Q39. Which two family names appear on both the war memorials?
A. COX & KNIGHT
Q40. Which house has a cat on the roof?
A. DENMEAD COTTAGE

Cross the road with great care and retrace your steps back through the underpass. Turn left immediately after the underpass and follow along Mounter's Lane back to the Cardiac Rehab Centre.
